1. Summary of our assessment

We have assessed that:

- Our In Later Life mortgage product range continues to meet the needs, characteristics, and objectives of customers in the identified target market.
- The intended distribution strategy remains appropriate for the target market.
- The Products provide fair value to customers in the target market (i.e. the total benefits are proportionate to total costs).

2. Product characteristics & benefits

Our later life mortgage products are designed to meet the needs of the target group, being borrowers looking to secure mortgage loans when they are already retired, or that will extend into their retirement during the term. The product features and criteria are designed to support these needs.

- Maximum LTV 70%
- Minimum age of 55
- No maximum age at application
- No maximum term
- Interest only and capital & interest options
- Product options vary from time to time to meet demand and may include fixed and discount.
- Options to overpay (10% p.a. on fixed, 25% variable)

3. Target market assessment and distribution strategy

This target market assessment matrix segments the target customers for the Product, recognising their different needs to enable you to tailor the services you provide when you distribute the Products.

The Products are not designed for customers who:

- Are under the age of 55.
- Cannot demonstrate affordability from pension income, whether now, or in the future.
- Are purchasing/remortgaging a property to let.
- Do not meet our lending criteria.

4. Customers with characteristics of vulnerability

The Products are designed for customers that are over the age of 55 and are expected to last well into later life, which means many customers will have characteristics of vulnerability or will experience vulnerability over time.

Older borrowers may struggle to understand the product and the implications. Therefore, they may require additional advice and support to ensure they understand the information being presented to them and the implications of the arrangement they are entering into to reduce the risk of harm occurring.

Older borrowers are likely to experience health and bereavement problems during the term of the mortgage which may impact on their ability to deal with their affairs or maintain the mortgage payments. The Society has a team of experienced Customer Service Advisers that provide support by phone, email or face-to-face during the entire mortgage term.

The Society considers the needs, characteristics, and objectives of customers with vulnerability at all stages of the product design process to ensure that the product meets their needs. A framework is in place to consider the needs of Vulnerable Customers throughout the product lifecycle / customer relationship with the Society.

As a 'Distributor' you should continue to comply with your obligations to ensure you treat customers with characteristics of vulnerability fairly.

5. Our assessment of value
